A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

October is the month of reformation. The weather is reforming, preparing to take its turn into winter. The trees and fields join in as well shaping the familiar scenes we know from summer into a brilliant burst of color as all of nature is re-formed. As Lutherans, each October we celebrate reformation day to commemorate Martin Luther nailing his 95 theses to the church door in Wittenberg. We think of this as the moment that

sparked the reformation, where the church was re-formed.

Reformation is not just about change per-se. It is about a very specific kind of change: renewal.

Summer always changes to autumn and autumn to winter, the seasons bring us back to where we were before, but still carrying us forward in time. If Reformation is about being reshaped and renewed, where should the church look for inspiration? Martin Luther didn't want to do away with the things he had, he wanted to see them renewed. For Luther, the answer was to look back to a time when things were closest to what they should be today. I thank God for so many good things to look back upon, and to look forward to seeing renewal.

There were times before the brokenness and decline of the church throughout America knows today; before church splits, a time before society and politics influenced the church's views of God more than the Holy Bible. Perhaps this isn't such a bad place to start a new reformation, a renewal that brings the best things of the past back to life to be lived again in the future. Perhaps now is the time to start. It is the season of reformation after all. When you see me this month I would love to hear about the times you feel are worth looking back upon, and that you'd hope to see again in the future. God can do it.

Story of Impact: Relationships in Slovakia

Growing up, my siblings and I were adopted, which opened our eyes to the incredible blessing of not only being saved from physical death through adoption but also being saved from spiritual death through Christ. As I've matured, this understanding of being adopted into God's family has fueled my understanding that we have received an incredible gift of salvation, and therefore, are all called to live out the Great Commission.

Initially, I wasn't sure what to expect from Slovakia. It wasn't a place that I automatically associated with missions, but God transformed my heart, revealing the deep spiritual need there and showing me how He is moving in Slovakia.

SON focuses on countries where Christianity and the local church are fading due to past Soviet oppression. We saw the impact firsthand—one Soviet tactic was to build prisons next to churches. Pastor Daniel, who we worked with, shared how his grandfather, also a pastor, was threatened with death for ministering to the youth. Despite the danger, he continued his work, and now Daniel and his wife, Tatiana, carry on that legacy by pastoring their local church and partnering with SON to spread the Gospel in Ružomberok.

During our week at English Bible Camp, we reached children and families who wouldn't normally come to church. Parents sent their kids to learn English from native speakers, but in doing so, the children also learned the Gospel. This year's theme was about trusting God in different areas of life, using Moses' story. We explored lessons like trusting God in danger, when we make mistakes, when we feel unworthy, and when we need help.

The camp included crafts and music to reinforce these lessons. Kids made baskets and pompom sheep, symbolizing God's protection and Moses' role as a shepherd, and created sun catchers representing the Burning Bush. They also learned songs like "Jesus Loves Me" and "There is Power in the Name of Jesus." It was amazing to hear these children, many hearing about Jesus for the first time, singing about His power. Our prayer is that these truths will stay with them for years to come.

OUTREACH & MISSIONS

There was a moment at the end of the camp when we celebrated the week with a closing program where the kids presented skits and songs, showcasing what they had learned. Parents, siblings, and grandparents were all in attendance. As the children were sharing the Gospel through their presentations and singing "Jesus Loves Me", the parents hearts were moved- there was not a dry eye in the room. It was so clear that God was moving in the hearts of the children and families in Ružomberok.

Through these relationships and planting seeds of the Gospel, God gave me a heart for the spiritual orphans in Europe. We've all been given the treasure of salvation—how can we not share it? Whether it's across the world or across the pew, God calls us all to be part of making disciples of all nations.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE UPDATES FROM RECENT MEETING

Pastor's Report

Pastor Kevin reminded the council of the busy season ahead with Sunday School and ministries in full swing. He encouraged everyone to stay energized and committed, drawing inspiration from Apostle Paul's message to run the race with purpose.

Meeting Highlights

- Minutes & Reports: Accepted with a motion from Rob Hendrix and seconded by Ann Emmons.
- Baptisms: Over 20 baptisms this year, with 7 more anticipated this month.
- Resignation: Kim Pool has resigned from the Council.
- **Strategic Leadership Team:** Becky, Jenny Pence, Tim Merkel, and Pastor Kevin will manage nominations for the team.
- Christian Education: Sunday school and catechism classes have started with over 140 attendees. New classes include "Focus on Families" and a 5-week prayer class.
- **Finance:** The Budget 2025 project is progressing. Financial reports for June and July are more accurate. Detailed General Ledger reports will be available by the end of September. Kenny Oberholtzer will provide a financial update on September 22.
- **Kitchen:** Wednesday Night Suppers are back with strong attendance and partnerships with local organizations.
- Missions: The Grow in Hope Ministry event raised over \$2,700.
- **Montessori:** 20 students enrolled with a silent auction fundraiser planned for November 6. The school will also have an art display at the fair.
- Nurture: Discussing plans for Christmas parade participation and snacks for the congregational meeting.
- Outreach: The Outreach ballot and projects are available for review and were approved by the Council.

COUNCIL — NOTES & NEWS

- Personnel/Lay Leader: Interviews are ongoing for the Director of Operations and Marketing/Communications Coordinator.
- Property: Exterior painting and nursery updates are underway. Strong Electric has installed light sensors in basement hallways.
- Senior Ministries: Recent and upcoming trips include Sugarcreek and Frankenmuth, and the Senior Celebration on October 28.
- **Women and Children:** Upcoming events include Movie Night on September 27th, Girl's Night Out on October 7th, and a Father/Son camp-out from October 11-13th. The Fall Festival is scheduled for October 20th.
- Worship and Music: Rally Day was a success with around 250 attendees. Men's Choir starts on September 17th, High Praise begins in October, and further meeting scheduled for September 23rd.
- Call Committee: Interviews for the Associate Pastor position occurred, with next steps and prayers requested for discernment.
