Welcome to Lent at Trinity.
Every year for 5 weeks before
Easter, Christians observe a
season called Lent. Lent is a time
to get ready. Just like someone
who prefaces big news by asking
"Are you sitting down?" the
church prepares for the most
significant news the world has
ever known. Are you sitting
down? Jesus has risen from the
dead. He has shown the whole
world that every claim,

every promise of God is true! There is new life in Jesus!

Well Christians don't prepare for Jesus' resurrection by sitting down, we prepare by standing up and living out the faith we hold in Christ Jesus. We prepare by turning away from the things that distract us or prevent us from living as God's people. We also prepare by doing the things God has commanded that we often neglect. HOLY WEEK & EASTER: MUSIC AND MEANING

Palm Sunday, March 24th

8:45am Traditional Service

The Cherubs, Notes of Joy, and the Choir will combine to lead the congregation in singing "The Palms." Hear the story of Christ's entry into Jerusalem and his Passion and Death for our salvation.

Maundy Thursday, March 28th

11am & 7pm Services

We gather at the Lord's table on Maundy Thursday, the first day of the "Three Days" or "Triduum," when Christians remember the sacrificial suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. The word "Maundy" comes from the Latin "mandatum" ("commandment"), which Jesus gives to us in our Gospel text. The three services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter are like the acts of a three-act drama, building in sequence to the conclusion in the last act on Easter. When the altar has been stripped and prepared for Good Friday, the pastor will dismiss with the words "Go in Peace." The Benediction will come when the Three Days are complete, and we have celebrated the risen Christ at Easter.

Community Good Friday Service, March 29th

12-3pm Service

We pray, sing and meditate on Jesus' final seven words that He spoke from from the cross.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service, March 29th

8pm Service

This service features a reading from the Passion according to St. John, the traditional reading for Good Friday. The music will be a response to sections of the Passion story, reflecting Christ's suffering for our salvation and our meditation on our own mortality. We will end with the Bidding Prayers, which date back to the early church in Rome. On the day Christ died for the world's salvation, we fittingly pray systematically for all people everywhere. The Office of Tenebrae ("Shadows") dates back to the seventh or eighth century A.D. and is characterized by the successive extinguishing of candles, representing the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. At the conclusion of the service, the Christ Candle will disappear, symbolizing the death of Christ. The noise signifies the closing of the tomb. The reappearing light symbolizes the victory of light over darkness, of life over death, when Christ rose from the dead on Easter. Thus, even in the midst of the mourning of Good Friday, we glimpse the promise of Easter Day.



Easter Vigil, March 30th

5:30-7pm Service

This service will act as a culmination of what began on Maundy Thursday, which is full of contrasts between darkness and light, death and life, chaos and order, slavery and freedom. Four sections comprise the Vigil of Easter: the Service of Light, the Service of Readings and Songs, the Service of Baptism, and the Service of Holy Communion.

We celebrate Jesus' resurrection with communion and music. The 8:45am service will include Trinity Bells, Trinity Brass and the Choir. The 11am service will include the Praise Team and a special choir.

COUNCIL — NOTES & NEWS

COUNCIL COMMITTEE UPDATES FROM THE FEBRUARY MEETING

Pastor's Remarks: In his monthly message, Pastor Kevin encouraged us to use the upcoming Lenten season to prepare our hearts for Easter by looking ahead to what God will do. He asked council members to consider who in the church community could potentially serve on council in the future.

Staff: Payroll system is implemented. Committee was formed to discuss the upcoming solar eclipse event on April 8 and potentially using parking lot.

Finance: Addressed the 2023 budget deficit, approved to hire an interim bookkeeper and will continue working with Whitcomb and Hess for the next six months.

Kitchen: Wednesday night dinners going well, now offering meals to the Ashland County Cancer Association's families. Luther Club starting up again in March.

Missions: 20 people applied for summer mission trips. Deadline is Feb 28th for summer Bible camp trips.

Montessori School: Hired new office assistant. Working on grants and financial reporting. Looking for lead teacher.

Nurture: Held website training session. Planning for Mother's Day flowers. Would like to recognize various church volunteer groups in the coming months.

Outreach: Recruiting new committee members. Exploring options for donating equipment to fire department.

Personnel: Updating PTO policies. Interviews continue for several open positions.

Property: Reviewed carpet, painting, and siding repair quotes.

Senior Ministries: Planning for the year and looking for more volunteers

Women and Children: Recent women's events were well attended. Planning upcoming mother-daughter event and VBS.

Worship: Lent/Easter service schedule announced.

Youth Ministry: Volunteer coordinating youth events during transition.
