A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Independence Day is almost here. It is the day we celebrate our nation's independence from British rule, and the birth of our own nation. Americans are known the world round for valuing our independence. Most of us value freedom and independence not only as a national identity, but as an individual one as well. President Herbert Hoover called us a nation of "rugged individualists" an identity he hoped to see us lean further into.

Most of us would be happy to oblige. But is that sort of independence really what our nation was founded on?

The idea of being a "nation" isn't a very individualistic idea at all. To come together as a people is to admit that there are things we share with each other, and to become a nation is to commit to sharing those things and more. To be a part of a nation is to disavow an independence that separates us from each other. The real purpose of our nation's independence is to allow us to be united with others

in a community where we believe we really belong. To call oneself a part of this greater whole is a humble and sacred confession.

God made us to live together. As Christians we believe that God is the one who has brought us together and holds us together. The Apostle Paul testified to this saying “...he (God) made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place...” Acts 17:26 The work of gathering people into a shared life is God’s work, and God’s will. But God’s purposes for this in not to elevate individual wealth or achievement. It is to draw us closer to one another and to him. That passage goes on to say “...that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us” vs.27 This is also the work of the Holy Spirit who we confess as the one who “...calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the entire Christian Church...” *Small Catechism: Explanation of the 3rd Article of the Creed*. God blesses people by uniting them to share an identity that is greater than our individual contribution to it. What a great gift from God.

As we celebrate Independence Day this year let us do it properly, by celebrating it *together*. For God has given us the freedom to live this life united to one another by common bonds that make us something greater together than what we are alone.



BROADWAY REVUE



COUNCIL REPORT: JUNE 2025 MEETING

Opening & Pastor’s Report

- Pastor Kevin opened with appreciation for a strong start to the summer season, especially celebrating the energy and success of Vacation Bible School. While many ministries are in summer mode, the church is entering a season of strategic planning and leadership training. The Strategic Leadership Retreat is scheduled for June 20th–21st, facilitated by consultants from The Malphurs Group. Training for Home Group Leaders and Sunday School teachers is also underway.

Key Updates & Reports

Approval of Minutes

- Dan Wierbicki moved to approve the previous meeting’s minutes, seconded by Jeff Gray. The motion was carried.

Staff Updates

- Pastor McClain will be out of town for a conference from June 30th to July 3rd. Ron and Kim will also be unavailable during this time. Pastor Neff will be on call for any pastoral needs. A discussion was held on building use—clarifying expectations for member vs. non-member events, facility stewardship, and handling issues like vandalism, cleaning fees, and wear and tear.

Old Business

- Strategic planning efforts continue, with an on-site visit from consultants taking place in June. Work has begun on Trinity’s mission, vision, and core values. The full process will unfold over the coming year.

COUNCIL REPORT: JUNE 2025 MEETING

Christian Education

- Rally Day is scheduled for August 24. Council members or a representative from their committee are encouraged to attend.

Finance Committee

- The six-month giving statements will be sent out during the first week of July via email or USPS, accompanied by a cover letter.

Grounds

- Spring planting is complete. Maintenance efforts are focused on watering and pruning throughout the summer.

Kitchen

- No report.

Missions

- No update at this time.

Montessori

- Interviews are currently being conducted to hire a new director.

Nurture Committee

- Members are encouraging the congregation to download the Church Center app, which will be used for the new photo directory. Help will be available after the 5:30pm and 8:45am services on June 21st and 22nd.

Outreach and Missions

- The Outreach Committee will hold its first meeting of the year on Thursday, June 19th, at 7pm. Five applications have been received for review.

Personnel Committee

- Staff review season is approaching. Discussions included budget planning and a potential hiatus for Wednesday night dinners. Shut-in ministry support was also reviewed.

Property and Grounds

- Air conditioning in the sanctuary has been repaired. Quotes are being gathered to remove the brick wall at the south property line (owned by Trinity). An infrared roof survey has been completed, with recommendations pending. Multiple leaks have been identified in the tri-tube boilers; a quote is expected from Standard Heating.
- TLC Properties balance for May: \$24,906.14, with an \$8,000 payout issued on May 29th.

Safety Committee

- No report.

Senior Ministries

- The Trinity Travelers' trip to Columbus was well received. A September outing is being explored. Planning has begun for the Senior Appreciation Luncheon this fall.

Women and Children

- Vacation Bible School hosted over 221 kids and 119 volunteers. The closing celebration saw more than 333 people in attendance. Planning is underway to fill the Preschool Director role. The Summer Reading Program begins July 7th with 59 children registered. Efforts continue to grow the 4th–6th grade youth group.

Worship and Music

- High Praise traveled to Buffalo, NY over Memorial Day and sang at two churches. The Broadway Revue is scheduled for July 11th. Choir Camp recruitment and preparation are ongoing.
- Aiden Chandler will lead one praise service a month this summer. Two music interns, Gabe Murawski and Emma McClain, are serving during July. Gabe will assist with the Folk Service, handbells, and the Christmas Musical. Emma will support preparations for the Broadway Revue, Choir Camp, and fall programming.
- The first Garden Service is June 22nd at 8:45am. Ron Marenchin will lead a two-part Sunday School series titled "Myers and Millers and Clarks—Oh My!" on June 22nd and 29th, highlighting Trinity's rich music history.
