A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This month our nation celebrates its 250th anniversary. America began as a nation on July 4th 1776 with the signing of the Declaration of Independence. But wasn't exactly the beginning. Paul Revere's midnight ride and the battles of Lexington and Concord occurred well over a year before; furthermore, the Revolutionary War wouldn't be decided until the British surrendered at Yorktown over 5 years later. The treaty which concluded hostilities was signed in Paris 2 years after the British Surrender. It begs the question: Why should we call the 4th

of July our Independence Day? The answer is simple but important, the truth began at the moment an irrevocable choice was made.

The founding fathers knew that this was the defining moment. Because their choice to live independently from the rule of those who had authority over them would change everything from that moment on. What began with a decision became the life that they would have. They would now need to sacrifice, to fight, to stand up for what they believed to be true and right, no matter what the cost.

The one who chose was Christ. How blessed are we to live in the greatest country in the world and to be citizens of the Kingdom of God, and all because of a choice for us!

KIDS CHOIR CAMP 2026

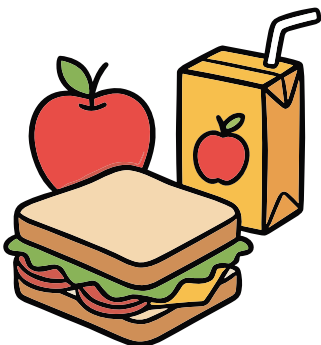
July 27th – 30th | 9am – Noon |

COUNCIL REPORT: JUNE 2026 MEETING

Opening & Administrative Business

Pastor McClain reported that staff is actively planning worship services, classes, and events for the upcoming ministry year with the goal of improving efficiency and maximizing ministry opportunities. Council also discussed a request for travel expenses to allow Pastor McClain to meet with Seminary leadership regarding Trinity's future Vicar placement and the possibility of adding a second Vicar. Staff training, planning, and employee reviews are scheduled for July.

Key Updates & Reports

Old Business

Council received updates on the Council Restructure process, including proposed changes to committee structures, council term lengths, and nominating procedures. The Sanctuary Design Task Force reported that the project scope has expanded to include restroom renovations, updates to the Bride's Room and Men's restroom, and minor library improvements.

Christian Education

- Elementary Sunday School teaching assignments are complete with 13 volunteers serving in the rotation.
- Students will focus on learning:
 - The Apostles' Creed
 - The Ten Commandments
 - The Lord's Prayer
- Students will present their memorization work to the congregation on May 9.
- Additional adult Bible study facilitators are still needed.

Finance Committee

- Council reviewed and approved financial reports through May 31.
- Increased giving and steady expenses continue to narrow the budget deficit.
- The committee is exploring additional cost-saving opportunities and designated fund consolidation.

Hospitality

- Plans are underway to establish a hospitality team to serve as hosts and greeters for church events.
- Opportunities will include Rally Day, VBS, Choir Camp, holiday services, and other special events.

Outreach

- The Outreach Committee continues reviewing grant applications.
- Committee representatives met with one applicant organization on June 8 to discuss questions regarding its request.
- Additional applications remain under review.

Grounds & Property

- The Rose Garden is being prepared for upcoming outdoor worship services.
- Tree trimming projects are being evaluated with quotes expected in the future.
- Exterior window washing was discussed.
- Construction of a new wall and door in the Montessori hallway is expected to begin within the next several weeks.
- TLC Properties reported a beginning balance of \$24,989.70 and an ending balance of \$24,981.55 following a \$2,300 disbursement.

Women & Children

- Vacation Bible School welcomed more than 220 children and nearly 100 volunteers.
- More than 50 students in grades 4–6 participated in programming led by Ryane Briggs.
- Summer Reading Program registration is off to a strong start with approximately 60 children already enrolled.

Worship & Music

- Preparations continue for Choir Camp, scheduled for July 27–30.
- Kings Brass will perform during worship services this weekend.
- Garden Services are scheduled for:
 - June 28
 - July 26
 - August 9
- On July 26, Praise Worship will be held in the Garden at 8:45 a.m., and Traditional Worship will be held in the Sanctuary at 11:00 a.m.
- Rally Day is planned for Labor Day weekend.

Youth Ministry

- VIBE will return on Wednesdays in July for students who have completed grades 6–7.
- Summer Share Group will meet Thursdays in July for students who have completed grades 8–12.
